Trip Narrative/Comments (about skills and conditioning of students):

Snow free for the first 1/3 mi., the rest of the route to the basin we saw bits of the trail at most. Participant #2 did the majority of route finding and accurately tracked our progress all day.

At the upper end of Bean Creek basin, we ascended steep snow slopes to the saddle between Bean and Earl Peaks. From this location we put our ice axes away, and scrambled rock along the ridge the final 400 vertical feet to the summit.

We descended via the ascent route, enjoying approx. 500' + of glissading.
